### **CAMPAIGN AGAINST MODERN SLAVERY**

Dear Friends,

Having had a number of cars scratched by mechanical car washes over the years, I was one of the people who welcomed the arrival of the hand car wash teams. Instead of sitting in the car hearing various clunks and clangs and the occasional screeching as somebody else's aerial was dragged over my roof, I was able to sit while a team of up to six people would descend on the car, giving it a wet wash, a soapy wash, a wheel clean and a final polish

It never occurred to me I might be colluding in modern day slavery as I paid my £5 and drove away in a gleaming car. But it now appears that car wash teams can easily be at risk and could be the victims of modern slavery. They could be people who are being cruelly exploited.

It is an example of modern slavery being perpetrated in communities in plain sight. But what do we do if we suspect that the team of people descending on our cars are in fact being paid very little and have forcibly become completely subject to another person's control?



Safe Car Wash

Help is at hand... in the form of an App. For the technically minded the new Safe Car Wash App, launched by the Church of England's campaign against modern slavery and the Catholic church's anti-slavery project has now been launched which can be downloaded for free on to Apple and Android devices.

Users can open the app when they are at the car wash and pinpoint their exact location using GPS.

They will be taken through a series of indicators of modern slavery ranging from practical details such as whether the workers have suitable protective clothing and whether they appear withdrawn.

According to the answers, App users may be directed to the Modern Slavery Helpline. Data will be anonymised and shared with the National Crime Agency and the Gangmaster and Labour Abuse Authority.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby welcomes the App saying through the safe car wash app we now have a change to help tackle this scourge which is damaging people's lives. It is hoped the App will help to engage the public in identifying car washes where slavery is suspected and will also help law enforcement identify those people who may be at risk as well as those criminals exploiting the vulnerable. I am sure none of us want to collude in modern slavery, so the Safe Car Wash App will be a useful tool in tackling human exploitation.

Meanwhile I hope you still see my car nice and gleaming as we get the all clear for our local car wash teams.....my days of using a bucket and sponge are long past!
