### **New Year Plans**

When January rolls around, many like to plan the year ahead out. Those people are the organised ones, who start to fill in their shiny, new diary. Each milestone and family occasion goes into the diary. Special events, anniversaries, and birthdays are all filled in. The holidays are carved out. Before too long, their diary starts to look full.

Whatever your plans for the year ahead, whether it involves picking up new habits or hobbies, or simply flooding the calendar with events that you look forward to, it's important to remember the following important truth. When we plan, we can know that we are already part of a bigger plan. It's a much better plan too.

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you, plans to give you hope and a future". (Jeremiah 29:11).

Aren't those words beautiful?

They were written to the people of Israel who were in captivity in Babylon. The book of Jeremiah details the judgment that God's people faced as a result of their sin. That's why Jeremiah is known as the weeping prophet. Have you ever visited the Sistine Chapel? There you would have seen Jeremiah, painted by Michelangelo, in a posture of anguished lament. Indeed, so horrendous was the plight of God's people, Jeremiah was told not to marry and have children. And yet, in the book of the weeping prophet, we have those beautiful words above. Despite the rebellion of the people against God, despite the pain of their current situation, despite the captivity that would last 70 years, God's plans for his people were good.

Maybe there will be challenges for us in 2026. Maybe the feeling of exile in this world will grow. However, whatever dark valleys we walk through in 2026, we can be aware that God's plans for us are good.

So, what are the plans that God has for those who trust Christ?

#### "He has plans to prosper you and not to harm you".

Sometimes we need to keep reminding ourselves of the simplicity of the gospel message. God is Jesus. It is Jesus who fully reveals to us who God is. He does not want to harm us. God is not out to get us. He's not looking to trip us up. He loves us. He wants to prosper us.

If we need proof of that, the Apostle Paul reasons in this way, "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?" (Romans 8:32).

If our heavenly Father gave his only Son for our salvation, can we really doubt his plans to prosper us?

#### He plans to give us hope and a future.

Biblical hope is solid and secure because it's based on Jesus, not us. This hope is not pie in the sky thinking. In other words, it's very different from the hope we might have for the success of our favourite football team. Christian hope can be trusted. It's a hope that will come to pass. It's hope that is based on an event of history, the resurrection of Jesus. Because of Jesus, we can have an indestructible hope, even when things may seem hopeless. There is a future too.

As Jesus is the resurrection and the life, even death cannot prevent us from enjoying this future that God has for us. This is a future with him where there will be no more tears, or pain, or death.

In Jeremiah's day, God brought his people back from captivity. We too are offered forgiveness from sin and freedom from that captivity. We are offered a hope and a future. So, let's remember God's good plans for us in 2026.
